

Shingles Can Cause Severe Headaches; The CBCD Reviews the Medical Evidence



However the risk of shingles increases as you get older. About half of all cases occur in men and women 60 years old or older." (6)

Are there treatments currently on the market, which target the Varicella Zoster Virus (VZV)?

Yes there are.

Antiviral drugs, such as Zovirax or Valtrex are designed to fight the shingles virus. However, these medications, when effective, only work to shorten the time of the shingles outbreak. They are ineffective against the latent VZV virus. (6)
