"Most of the Navy Veterans we try to help are over 60 years old and their navy asbestos exposure occurred in the 1950s, 1960s or 1970s on a ship, submarine or at a shipyard. Individuals who had heavy exposure to asbestos in the navy or at work have a five times greater

chance of developing lung cancer. Most people like this are totally unaware the \$30 billion dollar-asbestos trust funds were set up for them too.


TVA, manufacturing or industrial workers, public utility workers, plumbers, electricians, welders, insulators, millwrights, pipefitters, auto mechanics, machinists, coal miners, or construction workers. 
