



Savannah Resident Appointed Deputy Assistant Secretary in Trump Administration

Former Georgia Labor Official Tapped to Help Lead National Workforce Development Efforts

Khalid Sheikh Mohammad, et al. ("The 9/11 Case"). The couple has two children and will reside in Washington, D.C. during her tenure.
